Quiet Pint Patio Pet Policy and Rules:

NC Health Code Rules:

North Carolina regulation to the Food Code related to dogs and cats in outdoor dining areas. Dogs and cats are allowed in outdoor dining areas provided the dogs or cats are physically restrained and do not pass through the indoor area of the food establishment. All live animals, including pet cats and dogs, are not permitted to come into physical contact with any serving food, serving dishes, tableware, linens, utensils, or other food service items. Employees of a food establishment who prepare or handle food must not physically contact any live animals.

NC Health codes strictly prohibit animals from being on seats or tables due to contamination risks. Any deviation from this could result in serious ramifications for the restaurant, including fines and penalties.

We love our four-legged friends, but we need to be respectful of everyone who frequents our restaurant. Please respect them and us by observing our pet patio policy.

Quiet Pint's Rules.

- We allow two pets per table. Unfortunately, from our past experience, multiple dogs at a table are not well-behaved and are hard to control.
- DO NOT allow your pet on chairs or tables!!!!! The animal is also not allowed to sit on your lap. All animals MUST be on the floor, in a carrier on the floor, or in a stroller.

- Only dogs that are well-behaved around people and especially children are allowed on the patio.
- Please keep your pet close to you and clear the walkway.
- Animals MUST remain on a leash and keep from socializing or jumping on other guests or employees.
- DO NOT feed or water your animal from any dishware from the restaurant except for designated pet bowls. Also, please leave pet bowls on the ground. Do NOT place them on the tables. If they are in the walkway, move them under the table when leaving.
- You may tie your animal's leash to a chair, but please do not tie them to a table.

You will be asked to remove your dog for any of the following behaviors:

- If your animal is seated in a chair or on your lap.
- Your animal is walking on the table, chairs, or benches.
- Any dog showing aggression to children, other animals, other guests, or employees.
- Any animal that jumps, nips, or disturbs other guests and/or employees.
- Constant barking.
- Eating or drinking from restaurant tableware.

We reserve the right to refuse service to any guest as well as their fourlegged friends. It is up to the discretion of the manager on duty and staff if your animal is not well-behaved, to ask you to leave.

IMPORTANT: The Customer is fully responsible for the actions of their pet. Aggressive behavior or violation of our animal policy will not be tolerated and may result in being asked to leave. Any injury caused by your animal is the responsibility of the guest who brought the animal.
